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GEODE COMMENTS ON ACER WORK PROGRAMME 2016

GEODE, the voice of local energy distributors across Europe welcomes the

opportunity to provide comments on ACER draft Work programme 2016.

GEODE supports the tasks and deliverables proposed by ACER in the draft

work programme for 2016 which seem to be sensitive - in particular those

regarding Network Codes, the internal market monitoring and REMIT.

We particularly support the importance of prioritizing the adoption and

implementation of Network Codes both in electricity and gas. For instance,

Member States will have to 'translate' the common methodologies, principles

and criteria into reality, define non-exhaustive requirements in the connection

codes and decide on the application of the requirements on existing installations

and on derogations, if any.

When it comes to the implementation of the Network, we also would like to

highlight the need for a quick set-up of transparent Stakeholder Committees -

prepared by ACER and ENTSO - in order to facilitate the EU monitoring the

implementation of Codes & Guidelines at Member States and regional level. It is

important to intensively involve DSOs throughout the entire implementation

process. As system operators, DSOs will have to carry significant

responsibilities for the successful implementation of the codes, and therefore

need to be active participants in all stakeholder discussions. It is very important

to develop similar structures at national /regional level with the involvement of

all stakeholders, in particular DSOs and in coordination with European

stakeholders committees.

At last, we believe - in terms of electricity Network Codes - that all main areas

are covered by the Codes already drafted and that no new initiatives are

required at the moment. The adoption and implementation should come first.



GEODE appreciates the Agency's monitoring activities such as providing support for the implementation of the IEM - e.g. through the 5^{th} annual market monitoring report. GEODE is willing to contribute to this work.

REMIT is considered by GEODE as high priority and we welcome the work done and support the Agency monitoring wholesale energy markets and trading activities, increasing the level of trust in electricity and gas markets and thereby improving the reputation of all market actors, including DSOs.
