## **Event Concept**

On 8 and 9 November South Tyrol will set the scene for this year's **GEODE Autumn Seminar**. Hosted by GEODE's Member SEV (South Tyrol Energy Association), the Seminar will explore – starting from the best practices in the hosting region – the role of renewables and grids in promoting local development and paving the way for the energy transition.

The core of the programme will consist of **presentations on renewable energy projects** by local energy companies and grid operators in South Tyrol and across Europe. Showing how these actors are leading the way towards a sustainable future, the presentations will cover some of the key renewable energy solutions ranging from **hydropower** and **district heating** to **hydrogen** and **biomethane**.

Discussing on **existing projects** and exchanging on **real life experiences** is indeed essential to better understand how the EU's energy and climate objectives are concretely implemented at national and local level. This is even more important at this stage when the EU is working on ambitious plans – **Fit for 55 Package** and **REPowerEU** above all – to decarbonize its economy and stop its reliance on Russian fossil fuels. In this regard, the Seminar will also address some of the most relevant provisions of these plans, including the recent proposals to **accelerate permitting procedures** for renewable energy projects in Europe.

Beyond providing insights on these projects and policy developments, the event will also be an opportunity for local energy companies across Europe to share and exchange on **new ideas** on the central role of grids in this new energy era.
